

Rising 12 stories from the majestic Ozark ridge, the remarkable structure will house luxury tower suites, each two stories tall, complete with 5 bedrooms, private bars, outside decks, fireplaces, and unobstructed views of Table Rock Lake and the Ozark Mountains.

Concert for Conservation tickets will be available April 19 on Ticketmaster for \$10 per person, with free parking provided for all guests. As part of Morris' mission to create "America's most beautiful outdoor amphitheater," he donated 1,200 acres of land at the Thunder Ridge site, as well as all buildings, and infrastructure, permanently setting them aside as part of a not-for-profit foundation committed to the cause of conservation.
